## **MINUTES**

### TELLURIDE REGIONAL AIRPORT AUTHORITY BOARD MEETING

July 19, 2018 12:00 pm

1. Call to Order 12:04pm

Vice Chair Ann Brady called the meeting of the Telluride Regional Airport Authority to order.

Roll Call

Present: Chair Jon Dwight (phone), Vice Chair Ann Brady, Board Members Larry Crosby, Gary Bash, Lynne Beck, Kris Holstrom, Matt Skinner. Board Alternates, Mark Silversher, Richard Child.

Also present: Kenny Maenpa (Airport Manager), Linda Soucie (Administrative Assistant), Peter Kirsch (Kaplan,

Kirsch & Rockwell), Alec Seybold (Flight Tech Engineering, LLC.).

Absent: Board Members Sean Murphy, Mick Francis.

- 2. Public Comments None
- A. Approval of Minutes: June 21, 2018

#### Motion

Lynne Beck motioned to approve the June 21, 2018 minutes. Kris Holstrom seconded the motion. Motion passed 7-0.

B. Chairman Report

Ann Brady asked to move the Planning Committee report to the end of the meeting after the guest's presentations.

- C. Financial Report
  - 1. Approval of Accounts Payable

#### Motion

Gary Bash motioned to approve the Accounts Payables. Larry Crosby seconded the motion. Motion passed 7-0.

2. Lease/Purchase Agreement: Aircraft Mobile Fuel Truck – Wells Fargo
Kenny Maenpa explained the Lease/Purchase Agreement. It is for the new Jet A fuel truck, replacing
the 1978 model truck. Kenny Maenpa received 3 bids for the new truck, Skymark was the best bid. The
7000 gallon refueler is ready for delivery. Wells Fargo has set up a 7 year lease/purchase with no
prepayment penalty. The total financed is \$269,418.24, with monthly payments of \$3200.00. Kenny
Maenpa intends to pay it off with a budgeted line item in 1-2 years. The existing fuel truck will be
converted to a water tender for firefighting.

#### Motion

Kris Holstrom motioned to approve the Lease/Purchase Agreement for the new fuel truck and authorize Ann Brady to sign the Agreement.

Larry Crosby seconded the motion.

#### D. Committee Reports

- 1. Noise Abatement Kenny Maenpa There has been 1 complaint since the last meeting. A Hastings Mesa resident called and complained about a neighbor, who flies his helicopter in and out of his property. TEX is not responsible for that activity, but will make the pilot aware of the noise abatement policy if he comes into TEX for fuel.
- 2 Planning Committee moved to end of meeting.
- 3. Marketing Larry Crosby reported that the Marketing Committee met and made a quick decision to spend \$45,000 on media purchases (Elite Traveler and Robb Report). \$40,000 of the total came from TRAA and \$5000 from CFA.
- 4. Finance Gary Bash reported that he and Lynne Beck and Kenny Maenpa met and discussed the new fuel truck purchase, the air carrier grant and a possible benefit package changes for the 2019 budget. They will be meeting early to start discussions on the 2019 Capital Budget, then meet with the Planning Committee to finalize the Capital Budget.
- E. Airport Legal Update: Peter J. Kirsch Kaplan, Kirsch & Rockwell, LLP Peter Kirsch was present to give his update on legal issues.
- GLA rent credits in exchange for abandoned equipment still in process.
- 2. Hawker crash litigation the lawsuit against TRAA has been dismissed and we are entitled to attorney's fees. The Hawker's owners are continuing the suit against the FAA and TEX is cooperating with the FAA in their defense. The FAA will start interviews tomorrow.
- 3. Peter Kirsch is reviewing contracts the new fuel truck purchase, etc.

Over the next 6 months, Peter Kirsch will be reviewing and updating:

- Whistleblowers Policy
- Conflict of Interest Policy
- Sexual Harassment Policy
- Rules and Regulations
- Bylaws
- Minimum Standards
- 4. Replacement of Air Carrier Service Kaplan, Kirsch and Rockwell is advising Kenny Maenpa. There was discussion on what is ok and what is not ok to offer/cover as far as airline sponsorships. Basically, you cannot give an airline anything that you had to buy (money, fuel, etc.). You can give them something that you did not buy (services, rents, etc.).
- F. Colorado Flight Alliance Report

Matt Skinner reported on the federal Small Community Air Service Development Grant. The FAA requires a cancelled check to disperse grant money, so CFA billed TRAA and the grant money (2017-2018 drawn down) will be reimbursed to TRAA. This reimbursement will be for \$251,129.00, which leaves \$250,000.00 in the grant allowance.

#### Motion

Gary Bash motioned to approve amending the 2018 Capital Budget as follows:

\$251,129.00 in expenditures to CFA

\$251,129.00 in revenue from the SCASD Grant

Lynne Beck seconded the motion.

Motion passed 7-0 (Matt Skinner recused himself from the vote).

Matt Skinner reported that he has run into headwinds with the CR7 aircraft. The carriers are not willing to operate the CR7 into TEX at this time. There are other appropriate aircraft coming online in several years, and they are looking at B Class aircraft for TEX in the meantime. Matt Skinner is still pushing hard for service for the 2018-2019 season.

G. Navigational Approaches Cat C Aircraft – Alec Seybold, Flight Tech Engineering, LLC. Alec Seybold gave a presentation on the Cat C Approach and commercial service acquisition. There was discussion on approaches, aircraft types, "virtual towers", navigation limitations, Runway 27 Cat D testing, approach simulations (videos). All the work that TRAA has invested in with Alec and Flight Tech is still viable and very important. Flight Tech is still developing the Cat C public approach and maintaining the special private approach. CFA is cost sharing some of this work. The contract with Flight Tech is budgeted for and approved. Alec Seybold paused his presentation as some of the Board members had to leave.

D.2. Planning Committee – Ann Brady reported that an Executive Session cannot be held, as it was not noticed. The Planning Committee met with Kenny Maenpa. Kenny has been at TEX for 1 year and received a favorable review from the Planning Committee.

Ann Brady went around the table and asked for Board comments:

Lynne Beck commented that she likes having the monthly Finance Committee meetings.

Kris Holstrom said that Kenny is completely approachable and works well with San Miguel County officials.

Richard Childs commented that Kenny projects professionalism.

Matt Skinner said he appreciates Kenny's collaboration on the air service issue.

Ann Brady directed the Board to send any other comments to the Planning Committee.

There will be a formal evaluation in November.

Kenny Maenpa commented that all the TRAA Board Members are helpful and welcoming and he respects their knowledge and history.

Kris Holstrom reported that Joan May has been appointed as the SMC alternate for the TRAA Board for the next 6 months.

Alec Seybold resumed his presentation with videos of the simulator training on the Cat C circling (27) approach into TEX with and without engine failure.

4. Airport Manager Report

A. Updates

- 1. Terminal Project Kenny Maenpa reported that the terminal project will be ready for the Fire Marshall and Building Department inspections next week.

## Update

AIP-34: Apron/Taxiway Reconstruction. All schedules are complete, Kimely Horn has completed and submitted final reports. Final drawdown and payment expected in August.

AIP 32: De-Ice Pad. Irrigation on the vertical wall installed and observed vegetation germination in June. Close-out of the project expected by September.

#### Terminal Improvements:

- All sprinklers in the terminal building have been installed. Installation and testing of the diesel 100KW generator and pump skid occurred on Thursday 7/12. Pump room enclosure in the hangar is near completion. SMC Building and Telluride Fire inspection completed by 8/15.
- 2. Septic system Coordinating with Reams Construction for the completion of improvements as approved and permitted by SMC, expect work to start in September.
- Customer Service Delivery of SkyMark Fuel Truck (7000-gallon Jet A) on Aug. 7th. Coordinating the final upgrades and installation of the TCS remote fuel meters the week of August 13<sup>th</sup> for the mobile fuelers.
- 4. Terminal Art Display Two local artisans have been allowed to display art pieces in the GA terminal. Work is available for purchase to airport patrons.
