MINUTES

TELLURIDE REGIONAL AIRPORT AUTHORITY BOARD MEETING

June 21, 2018 12:00 pm

1. Call to Order 12:12 pm

Chair Jon Dwight called the meeting of the Telluride Regional Airport Authority to order.

Roll Call

Present: Chair Jon Dwight, Vice Chair Ann Brady, Board Members Larry Crosby, Gary Bash (phone), Mick Francis, Lynne Beck, Kris Holstrom, Lars Carlson. Board Alternates, Mark Silversher. Also present: Kenny Maenpa (Airport Manager), Linda Soucie (Administrative Assistant). Absent: Matt Skinner. Board Alternate Richard Child.

There was discussion on Board member appointments and requirements.

- Public Comments None
- A. Approval of Minutes: March 15, 2018

Motion

Mick Francis motioned to approve the March 15, 2018 minutes. Kris Holstrom seconded the motion. Motion passed 7-0.

B. Chairman Report

There was a Planning Committee meeting today. The Committee went over the budget and the financials are looking good so far for the year. There was discussion on fuel pricing strategy. The high Administrative expenses were due to the Airport Manager transition. There was discussion on the restricted reserves (PFC's, FAA accounts), and the non-restricted and internally restricted accounts.

Jon Dwight reported on the Telluride Pilot's Association event held here last night. Jim Luccarelli started the group in 2005. The goal is to use the Airport as a social gathering/event place for pilots. There was discussion of the TPA coordinating with TEX for the annual Cars & Colors pancake breakfast. There was also discussion considering doing an airshow at TEX again. Lynne Beck asked about insurance requirements for such an event. Kenny Maenpa responded that we would need to notify our insurance company, but the performers would provide their Certificate of Insurance.

C. Financial Report

Larry Crosby asked about the \$1 million surplus in the Capital budget and whether those funds were invested and returning any interest. Lynne Beck is looking into COLOTrust (government pool) that would be appropriate for a local government.

1. Approval of Accounts Payable

Motion

Lynne Beck motioned to approve the Accounts Payables. Ann Brady seconded the motion. Motion passed 8-0.

D. Committee Reports

1. Noise Abatement - Kenny Maenpa - There have been no complaints since February.

2. Planning Committee – Jon Dwight, Ann Brady, Larry Crosby and Kenny Maenpa met today. They have reviewed and are making a recommendation for the Airport Engineer selection. Three firms submitted proposals after the RFQ; Kimley-Horn, RS&H, and Jviation. The RFQ is required every five years. The Committee recommends Jviation. There was discussion regarding references, Kenny Maenpa's experience with the firm, etc.

Motion

Larry Crosby motioned to approve Jviation as the engineering firm on-call. Ann Brady seconded the motion. Motion passed 8-0.

3. Marketing – Larry Crosby reported that he, Matt Skinner and Kenny Maenpa met and discussed spending the \$40,000 intended to reach the elite market. Kenny Maenpa is working with 'Business Views' (an AOPA publication) and rewriting an article for publication. Matt Skinner will be helping with the rewrite. They also discussed TEX hosting the Colorado Operators Association conference in June of 2020. Kenny Maenpa will participate in both upcoming NBAA events, Orlando for the big event in October, and Schedulers and Dispatchers in February 2019. Matt Skinner and his wife may join him in Orlando this fall.

Kenny Maenpa is working with the Colorado Aeronautics Board to secure an appointment to that Board. It is a seven-member Board that awards the discretionary grants to the Colorado airports.

4. Finance – 2017 Audit Report

Kenny Maenpa reported that there were no significant deficiencies or difficulties and essentially the Audit was clean. Kenny Maenpa was interviewed by the Auditor and the resulting internal control suggestions were provided in a letter to the TRAA Board. Kenny Maenpa will bring those recommendations to the Finance Committee. There was discussion about the suggestions.

Motion

Lynne Beck motioned to approve the 2017 Audit Report. Kris Holstrom seconded the motion. Motion passed 8-0.

Mark Silversher joined the meeting.

E. Airport Legal Update: Peter J. Kirsch – Kaplan, Kirsch & Rockwell, LLP Kenny Maenpa reported that he had an update on the phone with Nicholas Clabbers. They are formally filing a suit against the FAA in the Hawker crash case. The damaged broom is being stored in Norwood. The FAA is to inspect it in July. There was discussion about the \$30,000 gap in insurance coverage for the new broom. Kaplan, Kirsch & Rockwell were used as counsel for the Jviation contract. Mark Silversher asked if the attorneys are reviewing the TRAA monthly Board meting minutes. Kenny Maenpa replied that they were not.

F. Colorado Flight Alliance Report Matt Skinner was absent. Kenny Maenpa reported that Matt Skinner is still working with three air carriers for December service.

3. Airport Manager Report

A. Updates

1. Terminal Project – AIP 34 (apron/taxiway reconstruction) is wrapping up. Kimley-Horn is preparing the final documents.

The De-Ice and Run-Up Pad Amendment #1 was approved for \$138,050. The retaining wall was designed as a vertical retaining wall, with no irrigation, that was expected to grow grass. It has been re-seeded, and the staff has installed an irrigation system and there is now grass growing on the wall. Terminal Improvements – The pump skid was delivered Monday and is being put in place, to be connected and tested within the next two weeks.

Septic System – During the construction last year, a toilet overrunning caused concern about the system being at the end of its useful life. A new system was designed and approved by the engineers and SMC. Kenny Maenpa looked into several different alternatives. It will be at least ten years before TEX can hook into the Aldasoro and Telluride public sewer line and would require a lift station for the 1600' distance and incline. SMC is requiring TEX to go ahead and install the designed and approved septic system and will require this to be completed before any final inspection. The new system will have a life span of about twenty years. The \$150,000 cost is in the Capital budget for 2018. There was discussion. The new FBO/customer service area new counter tops, etc. have been completed.

B. Actions

1. Great Lakes outstanding debt – working with them to try and get a credit for some of their equipment that is still here at TEX.

2. We have executed an agreement with FlightTech LLC (formally Dragonfly) for the instrument approach. They will continue to work on our approaches (lowering minimums, etc.) and to work with airlines on the onboarding process. This includes loading their simulators with our approach and helping them with that training.

3. Fuel farm back wall repairs are almost done by our staff. It was damaged in a severe wind storm in May. There was an insurance claim filed on the damage.

4. We were successful in bidding for the Yampa Valley surplus snow plow and will now have 2 brooms and 2 plow trucks. In August, Kenny Maenpa will be bidding on a couple of surplus snowplow blades from DIA.

5. The intermittent trouble with the radio activated lights on the airfield has been repaired. The problem was the coaxial cable running from the antenna. Both the cable and antenna have been replaced. There was discussion regarding monitoring safety issues and addressing them immediately. Jon Dwight suggested that the Telluride Pilots Association could help with reporting issues.

6. The 2018 Insurance renewal resulted in an increase of liability coverage from \$75 million to \$100 million with no cost increase. Kenny Maenpa received several quotes and Insurance of the San Juans was awarded the renewal.

7. New access gate at Gate #4 - Currently there is one way onto the ramp and one way off the ramp (Gate #2). This sometimes causes congestion during busy times with the taxi companies, limos, etc. Kenny Maenpa contracted with England Fence to install an exit only automatic gate at Gate #4. Kenny Maenpa would like to shift the cost of the gate (\$23,000) from the funds allocated for the kitchen improvements (\$45,000). There was extensive discussion regarding the Capital budget – Non-Grant Funded Construction, reallocating the money for the Gate #4, covering the \$150,000 cost for the new septic system, and the final payment to ProSet on the terminal improvements (\$17,000). Jon Dwight recommended holding off on the Gate #4 until 2019 and increasing the NGF Construction by \$170,000 for the septic system.

Motion

Lynne Beck motioned to approve the increase the Non-Grant Funded Construction line item in the Capital Budget by \$170,000 for the new septic system.

Kris Holstrom seconded the motion. Motion passed 8-0.

Kenny Maenpa will reduce the AIP 34 closeout by \$170,000.

Kenny Maenpa reported on the Colorado Operators Association Conference that he attended last week in Copper Mountain. The current pilot shortage is now being viewed as an issue of national security. Military pilots that the government has invested a tremendous amount of money to train are not reenlisting. These pilots are being paid \$100,000 to fly for commercial airlines.

4. New Business & Discussion

Mark Silversher reported that the web cam is not working.

AIRPORT MANAGER REPORT July 2018

Update

- AIP-34: Apron/Taxiway Reconstruction. All schedules are complete, Kimely Horn has completed and submitted final reports. Final drawdown and payment expected in August.
- AIP 32: De-Ice Pad. Irrigation on the vertical wall installed and observed vegetation germination in June. Close-out of the project expected by September.

Terminal Improvements:

- 1. All sprinklers in the terminal building have been installed. Installation and testing of the diesel 100KW generator and pump skid occurred on Thursday 7/12. Pump room enclosure in the hangar is near completion. SMC Building and Telluride Fire inspection is expected the week of 7/23.
- Septic system Coordinating with Reams Construction for the completion of improvements as approved and permitted by SMC, expect work to re-start in August.
- Customer Service X1 platform update completed in June. Coordinating the final upgrades and installation of the TCS remote fuel meters in the mobile fuelers in September.
- 4. Terminal Art Display Two local artisans have been allowed to display art pieces in the GA terminal. Work is available for purchase to airport patrons.

Manager Actions:

- Prepare master lease/purchase agreement for a new 7000-gallon aircraft mobile fueler.
- FAA Part 139 Certification- Annual Inspection scheduled for August 27-29th.
- Fuel Storage Shelter Repairs (Wind damage) completed by airport staff. All labor and materials have been submitted to Insurance.
