TELLURIDE REGIONAL AIRPORT AUTHORITY BOARD MEETING

January 17, 2019 12:00 pm

1. Call to Order 12:04pm

Vice Chair Larry Crosby called the meeting of the Telluride Regional Airport Authority to order.

Roll Call

Skinner, Kris Holstrom, Lars Carlson, Mick Francis. Board Alternate Richard Child.

Also present: Kenny Maenpa (Airport Manager), Linda Soucie (Administrative Assistant).

Absent: Board Alternate Mark Silversher

- 2. Public Comments None
- 3. A. Approval of Minutes: December 20, 2018

Larry Crosby corrected a bulleting issue in the Committee reports.

Motion

Gary Bash motioned to approve the December 20, 2018 minutes.

Kris Holstrom seconded the motion.

Motion passed 7-0.

B. Chairman Report (Larry Crosby)

The Planning Committee met this morning regarding Kenny Maenpa's annual review. Larry Crosby reported that TRA cleared almost \$1 million in profit for 2018. Kenny Maenpa will receive a 1.5% profit share distribution, per his contract. Kenny will also receive a 3.4% cost of living adjustment (figure from Mountain States Employment Council). The Board member input from Kenny's performance review was all positive. The Planning Committee put together a performance review letter to Kenny. As a result of this letter, the Planning Committee is recommending a separate performance bonus of 2.5% of his 2018 base salary (bonus would be \$3375.00).

Motion

Mick Francis motioned to approve the 2.5% performance bonus.

Lynne Beck seconded the motion.

Motion passed 7-0.

Jon Dwight thanked Kenny Maenpa and the staff for all their hard work. He heard several positive comments from customers over the holiday season.

C. Financial Report

1. Approval of Accounts Payable

The 2019 Budget was approved at the December meeting and the forms to go to the State were signed today. Thank you to the Finance Committee for their hard work. The 2018 final budget figures are in the packet for today's meeting. The figures include the \$105,000 net debt from GLA (after the \$20,000 credit for equipment gained from GLA). After legal negotiations with GLA and our Attorney, the equipment belongs to TRAA.

Lynne Beck motioned to approve the Accounts Payables.

Kris Holstrom seconded the motion.

Motion passed 7-0.

D. Committee Reports

1. Noise Abatement – Kenny Maenpa – There were no noise complaints in December. There were several phone calls (questions, not noise complaints) regarding the Dornier jet and the T6 that were in the area filming Monday 1/14/19.

There were 3 F16's in the area doing statewide training, but no complaints on their activity.

- 3. Marketing Larry Crosby asked to postpone the report until Matt Skinner arrived.
- 4. Finance Gary Bash and Lynne Beck had nothing to report.

Once the final lease is written for the new Airline service, Kenny Maenpa would like to have the Chair authorized to sign the Lease. The new Airline lease will be a 2-year agreement, with the same discounts and terms as the Boutique Air lease.

Mick Francis second the motion.

Motion passed 7-0.

The Electrical Equipment Building project is in the 2019 budget, however, because of the monetary amounts, Kenny needs authorization for the Chair to sign to accept the grant, accept fee negotiation for the engineering firm and the competitive bid acceptance for the project.

Mick Francis motioned to approve the Chair's execution of Engineering Services Agreement and the Grant and Construction Bid Award for AIP 35.

Matt Skinner seconded the motion.

Motion passed 7-0.

Updates

Kenny Maenpa reported that the new electrical equipment building will be a Valley modular building and is already 50% designed.

The Holiday traffic was wonderful, snow removal went smoothly, and the staff did a great job. There were 2 very positive comments; 1 on AirNav and 1 in person from a NetJets pilot.

The AWOS system has been repaired and works 100% of the time (it was broadcasting intermittently from Grayhead). A big thank you to Mountain Blade Runner (helicopter) for their help.

All the holiday fuel deliveries came in smoothly even with the I-70 road closures.

The heat went out in Hangar 29 1 night due to a frozen gas regulator. There was moisture in the gas line coming in from the supplier.

Kenny solicited and received 3 bids for janitorial service for 2019. The new service will start 2/1/19 and save \$800 a month.

Kenny is working with FastSigns on advertising in the terminal. FastSigns has teamed with Telluride TV and Telluride Magazine to add some content to the media displays.

Kenny will be attending the NBAA Schedulers and Dispatchers Convention 1/29-2/1/19. He will also me attending the CAOA annual conference in Denver 1/28-29. The FAA Northwest conference will be in March in Seattle.

Mick Francis asked about the new approach flight tests that are scheduled for the end of February and any effect from the ongoing government shutdown. There was discussion (1 TSA agent must be on the test flight), and the test may be postponed. The shutdown is affecting our TSA agents at TEX. Larry Crosby sent an email to Kenny and asked if there was some way, we could help the agents here. We are providing a lunch for the agents daily. Alpine Bank is offering government employees mortgage payment holds and no interest loans.

(3.D.3.) Marketing report – Matt Skinner had no marketing report.

(3.E.) Colorado Flight Alliance Report

Matt Skinner reported that Boutique Air has had a high number of cancellations and diversions that are not weather related in the last 2 months. CFA is working with them on the issue. Their diversions are going into Cortez now. BA has a vehicle to transport passengers from Cortez. All flights are booked and going well, and the schedule is year-round.

The second carrier is having technical integration problems with their sales systems. They probably won't be able to start up this winter, as they are missing the big selling season (right now) for the second half of the winter. The target start-up is now the week before Memorial Day. There was discussion on linking with the carrier, booking, Google, etc. The second carrier has their staff hired, diversion process in place and is ready. Kenny Maenpa led discussion on Boutique Air and the thought that they would start flying the King Air to handle the ski/winter luggage issue. The PC-12 can't carry skis and passengers have been frustrated. BA is working with ground luggage handling companies to accommodate skis.

New Business

Kris Holstrom reported that the hearing with the SMC BOCC and the SUP for the Spitfire Realty airstrip on Hastings Mesa will be 2/20/19. Jon Dwight asked Kris if there was generally public opposition or support for the issue and Kris reported that is was mixed. The SMC Planning Commission vote was 4-1.

Larry Crosby reminded the Board that the next meeting will be March 21.2019 (no meeting in February).

OPERATIONS

- B. The series of snow storms and removal operations has impacted operations. However, after weather conditions improve to allow aircraft operations, the closure of the runway for snow removal has averaged 1½ hours.
- C. Automated Weather Observation System (AWOS): Back-up antenna, VHF radio and connections on the airport AWOS site is operating without any issues.

• The 2nd airline office has been painted with new carpet. Airline has installed signage and installed equipment for expected start in May.

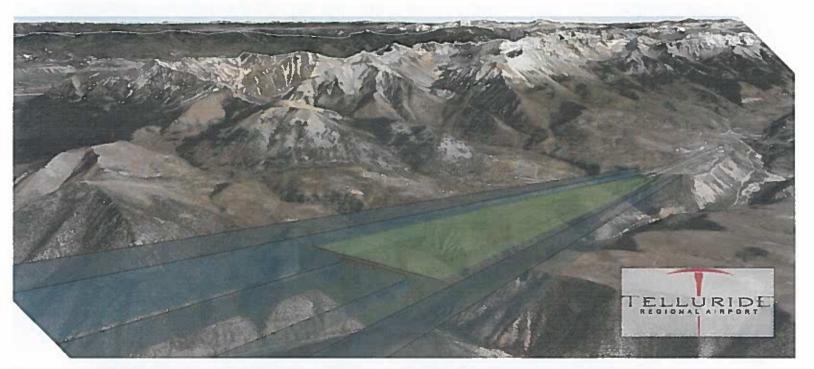

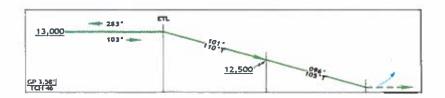
